

Gas Planning Process

Lay the foundation

- · Require inclusive, robust stakeholder process
- · Set planning within policy context
- · Coordinate with related processes

Develop a system map

- · Assess existing infrastructure
- Identify current customer base
- · Analyze demand, supply and risk

Explore alternative scenarios

- Develop scenarios
- Model scenarios
- · Consider transition planning

Create action and transition plans

- Short-term action plan
- Long-term transition plan

Prepare for next process

Layers of information can facilitate system planning


- Assessment of existing infrastructure

- Analysis of demand, supply and risk


